The Grand Master has set as his top strategic priority the re-building of our Youth Orders. This includes a 10-fold increase in the adult roles, a state-wide reopening of 100 youth groups over the next 5 years, a doubling of their active members, and sustained future support by all of us.

Particularly during this month of May, our Grand Master is calling on every Lodge in California to host special meetings or programs in which one or more of our Masonic Youth Groups are included. We as Freemasons are obligated to dedicate and commit ourselves to support these Youth Groups, and he has directed that specific actions by the Lodges show our commitment this year.

In a state of over 30 million people, we now have less than 5,000 members in our combined Masonic Youth Orders. It is time that we each accept a role in changing this. It is our investment in the future, and a most important way to extend our moral and ethical teachings to younger people.
